Sculpture Exhibition

Sir Tim Smit is set to open the Ashburner Prize sculpture exhibition at Stone Lane Gardens to the public on **1st July**. Sir Tim Smit is a cofounder of the Eden project and first gained notability with his re-discovery of the Lost Gardens of Heligan.

The prestigious exhibition will showcase the South West's emerging artists and will be open to visitors until October 31st.

Now in its 30th year the exhibition has received a record number of entries from artists competing for the prize (sponsored by Caradon Granite).

Located, near Chagford, only minutes from the A30 and Castle Drogo, the Gardens have been described as "a gem" by horticulturist and broadcaster Jo Swift. Stone Lane Gardens is an RHS Partner Garden, which holds a unique National Collection of Birch and Alder trees from around the world. The Gardens are an inspiration to artists and visitors.

The Business and Intellectual Property Centre in Devon (BIPC) has worked with experienced artists and experts to create a new FREE course designed to help early stage creatives to develop their business.

The 4 week Art of Business course starts on Monday 4th July and can be accessed both online and in person. Local Artists will be sharing their knowledge and experience, through interactive sessions at Exeter and Barnstaple Libraries, and online. The course will incorporate business skills for those working with: Written Word, Photography, Film-Making, Music, Painting & Sculpture.

Our skills-based workshops include marketing, branding, social media training, and web design. There will also be networking events for creatives to meet other like-minded individuals.

BIPC Devon's ART of Business Course runs throughout July and features weekly webinars and online workshops, interactive sessions, networking opportunities and 1-1 support.

Attendees will grow their business skills and learn how to find their niche, build an audience, grow a career as an artist, and find inspiration from the creatives delivering the course. The material will be recorded so participants can review it at their own pace. There will also be opportunities to join up with existing creative communities for networking sessions.



equality and challenge discrimination. In a difficult economic climate our need to earn a living is especially important. Our Advice Column this month highlights useful information for anyone in the jobs market.

"I recently applied for a job at a local pub which offered the National Minimum Wage. After a short interview the manager asked me for some documents and also how old I am. After telling her I am 25 she said she would be in touch but it was unlikely I would get the job as they wouldn't be able to afford to pay me the required wage. She said she would prefer someone younger. Is this legal?"

Here is our advice:

Nobody should be asking you your age at an interview. At 25 you're entitled to the National Living Wage. Details of the legal pay people are entitled to are on the Citizens Advice website. However, the rules don't mean that employers can avoid hiring people because of their age. That is 'direct age discrimination' as stated in the Equality Act 2010.

You're also protected by the National Minimum Wage Act 1998 which says employers can't not hire you or fire you because your age means you are entitled to a higher rate of pay.

- · As soon as you can make a note of what happened, what questions were asked and other remarks made by the interviewer
- Write a letter of complaint to the employer and keep a copy

with every step. www.citizensadvice.org.uk/work

• If that doesn't result in a satisfactory outcome you could take the employer to an employment tribunal but you will need to pull together as much information as possible including the job advert and your full notes on what took place

If you are taking the tribunal route you have three months minus one day from the date of the interview to start proceedings and if you need help and advice with this you can also contact ACAS who specialise in employment issues and provide advice free of charge.

In the Garden

Time to Harvest & Take Cuttings

July is the month you can really start to harvest in the garden. Dry lavender whilst it is at its best - just before the flowers are fully open. Hang it upside down in a cool, airy place to dry slowly with plenty of circulating air so that it doesn't shrivel. Flowers like achillea, gypsophila, zinnias and honesty seedpods can also be successfully dried.

If you have a shady place to put pots, or a cold frame, now is a good time to take semi-ripe cuttings of shrubs and conifers. Lavender, for instance, is a short-lived shrub and new plants are necessary every few years, to maintain a good, compact display.

Tip cuttings of non flowering shoots will soon produce new growth if conditions are right.

Remove the lower leaves and insert the stems into pots of compost. Keep them slightly damp and shaded until they start to grow.

Propagate clematis by taking internodal cuttings. This means cutting above a pair of leaves. From one shoot you can take several pieces, each with one pair of leaves on a long

stem. Place them around the edge of a pot with leaves resting on the compost and seal in a clear bag, or put them in a shaded cold frame.

New potatoes will be ready to harvest this month and look clean and bright as you lift them from the soil. Shallots and garlic can be lifted as the foliage begins to turn yellow. Leave them in the sun, or a dry place, to ripen.

Cut back herbs such as mint, tarragon, marjoram and sorrel. The new leaves they produce are much tastier than the old ones. You can still sow lettuce seeds to make sure you have a continuous supply of green leaves to accompany your ripening tomatoes.

It looks very much that summer weather is coming as I draft these notes. Temperatures are rising bringing the chance to get outside and enjoy the sunshine and the lovely area where we live. However, if it gets too hot for too long, there are health risks. Take care if you are vulnerable and look out for those most at risk.

All of us should make sure that we stay safe in the sun by covering up, using sunscreen and keeping hydrated. Also avoid being out in the peak heat from 11am - 3pm, move to shaded areas, take cool showers, drink plenty of water, wear a wide brimmed hat and loose fitting light coloured clothing and try to get air flowing through the home along with closing curtains during the day. Take care all and don't leave anyone / children or animals in a closed parked vehicle.

Suspicious Person

A warning to all that a phone call scam is taking place in Devon by a person calling himself Sergeant Martin Spencer, a police officer in London. He is apparently investigating the unauthorised use of a person's bank card. As has been said on occasions the Police will never contact people asking for banking details or requesting that they withdraw money from an account to aid the investigation. The police advise that anyone receiving such a call not to give any information and hang up their phone. Wait until you hear the dial tone and then call their bank using the number on the back of your card and also the police on 101.

Password Strength

There are 3 easy steps that can be taken to be more secure online:

- Use a separate password for your email account
- Use 3 random words
- Turn to two factor authentication

Ofgem

Apparently there are fake emails from Ofgem around stating that the recipient is due for a rebate from a newly announced government scheme. The links on the email lead to websites that are designed to steal personal and financial information. As N W has said many times, official organisations and banks will not ask for personal information via email or text. To check out contact the company using details from their official website. Forward a suspicious looking email to report@phishing.gov.uk

You may be lucky enough to be going away soon so here are a few tips to help ensure your safety.

- 1 Do research on accommodation, flights, cruises, package holidays etc, to check that they are authentic.
- 2 Check that accommodation does exist.
- 3 Check reviews on Trip Advisor or similar sites.
- 4 Pay by credit card with a good chance of getting your money back if things go wrong.
- 5 Travel agents and tour operators should be members of ABTA or ATOL.
- 6 Be wary of cheap holidays or high deposits.
- 7 Check terms and conditions.
- 8 Keep all paperwork and check statements for irregular payments and entries.
- 9 Be on your guard of callers who can arrange holiday refunds.

Message from St Mary's

New possibilities & exciting things to look forward to


