Hi everyone,

My daily rain dance doesn't seem to be making any difference as yet. It is a rare thing to have so many people desperately hoping for rain – especially on Dartmoor when we usually have plenty!

Thank you to everyone who is doing their bit to spread the word about low river levels and the high risk of wild fire. It all helps to protect this wonderful place.

Although most of our gardens are struggling, there are a few plants in the garden at Drogo that are loving this heat. One example is Coreopsis verticillata 'Zagreb'. It's a stunning herbaceous perennial that loves the sun and has a long flowering season. The foliage is light and feathery, so it is an attractive plant even when not in flower, and it prefers full sun and well drained conditions so is thriving at the moment.

For those who are mostly hiding under trees reading books in this heat (or is that just me?), we will be having a pop-up second hand bookshop at Finch Foundry for a month starting from **Wednesday 31st August**. Please do pop along to have a rummage or drop off any books you would like to donate. The bookshop

will be open from 11am until 3pm when Finch Foundry is open (closed on Mondays and Tuesdays).

Plans are also underway for Heritage Open Day. This is when we celebrate our wonderful heritage sites and open for free. There are four different options for you all. Lydford Gorge is taking part on **Saturday 10th September**, Finch Foundry on **Sunday 11th September** (please book via the website), and the hydro turbine house by the river at Drogo will also be open on **Sunday 11th September**. Community Led Solutions to Devon's Housing Crisis with quest speaker *Alison Ward*

Monday 19th September, 7.30pm, Spalding Hall

Alison will speak about the variety of housing projects which community organisations have taken on, including housing for affordable rent, part purchase, community shops and pubs. She will outline the support available for such projects.



Alison Ward is a community led housing adviser and co-founder of Middlemarch Community Led Housing CIC, a social enterprise supporting communities to develop their own affordable homes for local people - usually through

community land trusts. She and Steve Watson (when Middlemarch was called Wessex CLT) supported CBCLT to develop 8 affordable homes at Higher Shippon.

Middlemarch has worked with over 70 community groups, including 20 CLTs which have now completed their first affordable homes schemes. Alison was a trustee of the National CLT Network between 2014 and 2019 and has done research on funding mechanisms for community groups for the social finance organisation Resonance.

The Community Land Trust exists to hold and develop property for the village. It enabled the development of affordable homes in Cheriton Bishop and would be able to raise funds if needed for a further housing project, or to save a village facility, or to create a village resource (such as a community orchard). All welcome. You can also join CBCLT if you wish. It costs £1.

North East Dartmoor Care Saved!

North East Dartmoor Care, our communityowned not-for-profit charity, threatened with closure because of care staff shortages, has been saved in a dramatic rescue.

The rescue is through a new Partnership with Karrek Community CIC, another not-for-profit care organisation based in Cornwall.

They are providing a temporary Registered Manager and support to help NEDCare get back on its feet, to develop and hopefully grow the service for the communities in which it works.

NEDCare has run a regulated care service for adults in their homes for over five years, starting from nothing and now a viable and successful charity, owned and run by the communities of NE Dartmoor – Teign Valley; Tedburn & Cheriton; Chagford, Moreton and surrounding villages; Lustleigh & Manaton.

Feedback about the services provided by this charity has always been extremely positive and it has enabled many people to return to and remain in their own homes and in their own community despite significant levels of health and social care needs, thus freeing up beds in hospitals. Half of NEDCare's clients fund themselves; the other half are paid for by Devon County Council.

ACE Archaeology Club

We started our annual dig at Moistown in July on the then hottest weekend of the summer. We have calculated that whatever the temperature is in Winkleigh it is at least a degree or three warmer at our site at Moistown. Winkleigh was forecast for over 30 degrees. So, for the first weekend there were few of us and we only worked for half the day. When temperatures were forecast to reach 40, we didn't work at all as we had already reached that on the site on the days before! Normally we are complaining that rain stops us digging, but not this time.

We had the usual complement of finds from ancient to modern pottery, nails and large items of rust. One interesting find that needed a little research was a large coin or medallion. When cleaned up a little on site the reverse showed '40' and the obverse seemed to show a sunburst. We thought at first that it might be a commemorative medallion but research didn't find anything much worth commemoration for the date on the coin of 1857, or of 40 years earlier either. A little more gentle cleaning showed some of the writing and

looking at it under artificial light and angling the light so as to show up the relief, we could make out, 'republic' and 'centi'. Back to the internet. Turned out to be a 40 centimos coin from the Republic of Uruguay. How of earth did that find itself in a house in the middle of Devon? I think we will never know.

A note to anyone thinking of doing any illegal metal detecting on site, don't. It won't be worth your while and the site is monitored.

In addition to the dig, we also had our ACE days out and about last month, which found us exploring the Roman sites around North Tawton and looking at Bronze Age ring barrows in the same area. So good to look at local history.

Professor David Ganderton OBE

It is with much sadness we received the news of the sudden death of David at the age of 86, David was an eminent Scientist, he was a former Chairman of the British Pharmacopoeia Commission and led the UK Delegation to the European Pharmacopoeia. As a former member of the Expert Group 12, he took charge of the compendial control of products used for inhalation. He was a member of the Chemistry, Pharmacy and Standards Sub-committee of the Committee of Safety of Medicines from 1989 to 1999. For such services, an OBE was conferred in 1995. He received the Society's Charter Gold Medal for 1998, an award which marks an outstanding contribution to the profession of pharmacy nationally.

David, lived with his wife Joyce at Crooked Chimneys Cheriton Bishop for over 20 years, before moving a few years ago to Tisbury to be nearer family. David and Joyce were involved in many local organisations they were keen gardeners and walkers so were well known to many of us. Always pleased to stop and chat when walking around the village. David and Joyce fully entered the spirit of the village whether it was charity work, litter collecting or village celebrations. They were great supporters of the village produce show entering many exhibits most of which won prizes, David was particularly pleased to win first prize with his baking. He was

a past Chairman of the Gardening club, with a reputation for well run inclusive committee meetings which were a joy to attend.

On Moving to Tisbury David kept his love of horticulture; sharing his daughter's allotment, definitely raising the standard of produce... but could never quite get to grips with why the potatoes grown in Devon were SO much better!

His interest in baking continued, perfecting a very fine formula for a morning loaf, which did however involve a horrendously early start to get the proving going!

Whilst his hip permitted, Joyce and David joined the Tisbury Footpath Club for walks in the local area - the vistas never quite matched those of Devon, but they did come to love the countryside and coast.

He was able to pursue his love of classical music by finding a local hub of activity in the Cherubim Trust. This charity supports young musicians to loan high quality instruments that they would never be able to get for themselves. There were lots of concerts and he got involved as chairman.

Citizen's Advice



The Rising Cost of Living

There cannot be a single person who has not had a conversation about the cost of living crisis which seems to be escalating at an alarming rate and this month's question is typical of the thousands of requests we get each month asking for help and advice.

"The cost of energy and food is so high now. With the kids home from school for the summer, I'm having to pay more for lunches and snacks. I'm worried about how I'll put food on the table. I'm on a prepayment meter and I'm really scared we're going to be left without any gas or electric if I can't top up. What can I do?"

Our advice:

As a prepayment meter customer, your energy supplier will be able to give you temporary credit if you can't afford to top up your meter. They might add this to your meter automatically, but if they don't, you can call them and ask them to do this.

If you run out of temporary credit, speak to your supplier and explain your situation. They may give you extra temporary credit if you are struggling with living costs. If you're disabled, have a long term health condition or you have children under 5 you may also qualify to get extra credit. You'll have to pay back anything extra you get, but you can agree how to do this in a way you can afford.

CA TNMWD are working with Devon County Council to manage an Energy Relief Scheme and it could be that you qualify for fuel vouchers. We also have a specially trained Energy Advice Team who will provide free, confidential and informed advice. Either visit www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk click on 'Get Advice' then go to the Energy tab.

Alternatively, ring our free, local AdviceLine on **0808 27 87 999**. You may like to consider having a Smart Meter installed (at no cost to you) and this is something else out team can advise on.

There is more government support coming in to help with energy bills including a £400 payment. With a prepayment meter you will be given vouchers in the first week of each month from October.

If you pay council tax and are in bands A-D you may have already received a payment of £150 which is being automatically credited by local councils. If you haven't and you qualify, check out your council's website and see how you go about making a claim.

You may find it useful to check out **www. citizensadvice.org.uk** where we have benefits calculators you can use online to assess whether you are eligible to claim anything and there is also advice on how to reduce living costs and other ways to increase your income.

School holidays put additional pressures on everyone's budget. Contact your local council to see if there is extra support available to help you over the holiday period. At CA TNMWD we can also help you get a referral for a food bank voucher. You are by no means the only person in your situation so just reach out to us for help. www.ruraldevoncab.org.uk or 0808 27 87 999.

In the Garden

Dry Summer Gardening

After such a hot, dry summer, it is good to think that cooler wetter weather to come will allow gardens to grow rather than survive. It has been interesting seeing which plants flourish (lavender, coreopsis, cobea scandens, grevillea) and which plants suffered. Our normally reliable hydrangeas all looked very sad without water (the clue is in the name!)

It has been too hot to sow hardy annuals ready for next year but by September, California poppies (eschscholzia), calendula, cornflowers, should germinate readily. These are tough enough to grow throughout the winter and become mature enough plants by Spring to plant out for summer flowering. You can also plant out biennials like wallflowers and foxgloves. These will have been sown earlier in the year and are now big enough to plant out so that they can establish and are ready to flower next year.

As well as hardy annuals and biennials, it is a good time of year to plant perennials as soon as the soil is moist enough. These are the stalwarts of the garden which keep growing through drought, frosts and floods! It is the gardeners' job to work out which plants actually do this in our own particular gardens.

If putting new plants in is not for you, then you could try planting some bulbs for the Spring. The bulb is a store house of food for next year's plant so doesn't mind adverse conditions so much. If the ground is still too hard to dig deep enough holes (3 x the size of the bulb or as deep as possible) then putting bulbs into a container is an easier option.

All daffodils and narcissi will do well planted now but leave tulips until November.

In the vegetable garden, potatoes and onions can be lifted. Leave them to dry on a sunny day and then store them in a dark, cool and frost free place for the winter.

Autumn onion sets can be planted now and it is a good time to start garlic off, either in the garden or in modular containers in a sheltered spot.

Enjoy the vibrant colours of dahlias and tithonia now and keep dead heading to prolong their season of flowering.

Message from St Mary's

Goodbyes and New Challenges

September sees us saying goodbye to Rev. Prof. Tim Gorringe. Tim's final service is at 10.30am at Holcombe Burnell on 4th September.

Tim arrived shortly after I arrived here. He has taken services in all of our four churches for the last fourteen years. He has made my life much easier by covering services when I have been away, and I have appreciated his help. Tim has always challenged us to think outside of our normal expectations. He has been much appreciated and leaves a big gap in our church life. Inevitably, we think of an ending, for example, someone leaving or an end of a term, course or job. It is often much harder to focus on the beginning because by its very nature it is new and to be discovered. Usually, most people are worried more than they are excited, about something new.

In the life of the churches in these villages, there seems to be a greater challenge as Covid-19 has resulted in smaller congregations. The church finances seem even more difficult than ever. There is a real concern as to how the rural churches will survive going forward. There are obvious solutions, more people and more money. I feel that our churches work well with a congregation of twenty to thirty people but in many instances we are ten people short of that aspiration.

Would you consider coming to church or returning after an absence?

We have the most amazing churches in our villages. They can have a significant part to play

in all our life events like baptisms, weddings and funerals. They are available to all who are in the village, the only qualification is that you live in the parish! Churches provide a green space for people to come and enjoy. They provide a quiet place for reflection and sanctuary, just to name a few of the great benefits. However, without the money to run and maintain these churches, there is always the threat of closure. Could you help by contributing time or money to the running of the churches? Unless we contribute and support our churches they will stop being our church buildings. Then they then face an uncertain future as historic buildings open or closed or become repurposed for some other use. The Diocese of Exeter has a policy to support and keep open its rural churches, even those with small congregations, especially where there is local support.

As I read the Bible it seems to be always looking forward, not trying to reinforce the status quo but looking forward to a brighter future. The Bible offers the reassurance that as we make changes for the better, we discover more about God in the new situation we find ourselves in. It seems that the more vulnerable and reliant on God's grace we are, the better we will do in God's eyes. Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting

Held at Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop on Monday 11th July 2022

Present: Cllr Ball, Cllr Benjamin, Cllr Edwards (Chair), Cllr Jackson, Cllr O'Neill, Cllr Salmon,

Cllr Letch (DCC) and Cllr Coren (MDDC)

In attendance: The Clerk, three members of the public, a representative of 1st Tedburn and Cheriton

Scout Group and Jess Carter, the Mid Devon Wildlife Co-ordinator

1. To co-opt a new Councillor: Cllr Jackson was co-opted (Proposer: Cllr O'Neill, Seconder: Cllr Edwards.) Cllr Jackson's Declaration of Acceptance of Office was received.

2. To receive and accept apologies: None

- 3. To receive declarations of personal and disclosable pecuniary interests in respect of items on the agenda:
- 4. Public Discussion an opportunity for members of the public to make representations, answer questions and give evidence in respect of any item on the agenda: One member of the public expressed serious concerns about road safety issues on the Yeoford Road, particularly for those joining the Yeoford Road from Higher Shippon, which is very difficult indeed. Local residents are concerned there will be a serious accident because visibility is so poor and cars are driven at such high speeds. Councillor O'Neill explained that he has been waiting for some weeks for a response from the Devon & Cornwall Policy Traffic Casualty Reduction Officer and a response from DCC regarding a request for the 20 mph area in the village to be extended. With Cllr O'Neill's help, the member of the public will raise a petition to be submitted to DCC. Cllr Ball offered to check the planning consent for the Higher Shippon development to find out whether the junction with the Yeoford Road was constructed in accordance with the approved plans.

One member of the public expressed concern about a mobile home which is being lived in. A representative of 1st Tedburn and Cheriton Scout Group read out a letter about the Group's activities and the site at Crofter's Mead and invited councillors to visit the site.

Jess Carter, the Mid Devon District Wildlife Co-ordinator briefed councillors about the wildlife pilot scheme which is now running in 3 parishes, including Cheriton Bishop. Volunteer wildlife wardens are being sought. An induction and some training will be provided. Information and a request for volunteers has been put on the village and Parish FB pages and will be in the next edition of the Village Newsletter.

- 5. Cheriton Bishop Parish Council Meeting Minutes 13th June 2022 to consider the approval of the minutes as a correct record: It was resolved to approve the minutes as a correct record.
- 6. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors for information only: MDDC has supported the recommendations made by the Parish Boundary Review Team. The recommendations will now be sent out for a second consultation. This will be another opportunity for the Parish Council to object that it has not been agreed that Moor Park be brought into the Parish.

Bunnyhomes have informed Cllr Coren that they have now submitted their application for new homes off Church Lane. The hedge remains in situ. The Parish Council will be able to comment formally when consulted by MDDC.

7. To receive a report from Cllr Letch (DCC) – for information only: After a Freedom of Information request Cllr Letch has been informed that since 2019 DCC has paid out £181,000 in compensation to drivers for damage/accidents caused by the poor condition of roads. He will now ask for more information on staffing levels, defects and repair timetables and ask why County Councils are not lobbying for increased funding from the Government for road repairs. Cllr Benjamin reported to Cllr Letch that the road markings at Four Ways Cross have faded and the give way sign has been covered by overgrown vegetation. A parishioner had seen a driver go straight across without giving way at all. It was suggested that a second give way sign would be very helpful. Clerk to request.

8. Mid Devon District Council Planning Applications – to consider the following applications upon which the Council has been asked to comment:

Reference: 22/00836/FULL

Proposal: Change of use of agricultural land to dog walking paddock with associated car park

Location: Land at NGR 273175 92654 (West of Manor Farm) Cheriton Bishop

Applicant: Mr D Rowell

Councillors considered Policy DM 22 of the Mid Devon Local Plan and expressed reservations about potential increased traffic on the local road network and the resulting environmental impact, exacerbated by the fact that the site is not close to local settlements. However, it was resolved by a majority to support the application because, on balance, Councillors felt the advantages of supporting a local rural business by encouraging agricultural diversification on a family farm outweighed the disadvantages.

9. Mid Devon District Council Planning Decisions - to note appeals against the following decisions have been dismissed for reasons as filed:

Reference: 21/00082/OUT

Proposal: Outline for erection of 1 dwelling with all matters reserved Location: Land at NGR 277072 (Adjacent Glenthorne, Cheriton Bishop)

Applicant: Mr M Ayre

Reference: 21/01458/FULL

Proposal: Demolition of workshop & store and change of use of yard to residential to include the erection

of one dwelling

Location: Land & buildings at NGR 276526 94280 (Entrance to Haven Lea) Cheriton Bishop

Applicant: Mrs R Tripp

10. Planning – to consider setting up a Task & Finish Group to look at how best to approach communication and decision making for planning applications: After discussion it was agreed to set up a Task & Finish Group which all councillors who wish to will join. The Group will not make any decisions but will report at the September PC meeting. As a starting point Cllr Benjamin will re-circulate to councillors the guidance she put on the PC FB page last year.

11. PC Priorities and Performance – to consider the updated performance and review process:

Councillors agreed a minor amendment. The Clerk will publish the document on the PC Website and FB page, the Village FB page and in the Newsletter.

12. Mid Devon Wildlife Warden Scheme – to receive an update: Councillors noted the Co-ordinator's update in the public session and Cllr Edwards confirmed she is the point of contact in the PC.

13. The Old Thatch - to consider whether the PC can maintain the land fronting the main road:

Cllr Ball explained that he had been concerned that the area was untidy and created a bad impression for the village but reported that someone had already carried out the work.

14. Moor Park – to receive an update on the request for a parish boundary change and agree associated actions: Cllr Ball reported on the results of a small FB survey of Moor Park residents. The Clerk will make enquiries as to whom to contact at Teignbridge. It was agreed that it would be best to have more evidence and justification before contacting MDDC and Teignbridge DC. Cllrs Salmon and Ball agreed to contact Moor Park residents.

15. To receive and update on Operation London Bridge and agree associated actions:

The Clerk explained that Operation London Bridge sets out the protocol to follow after the death of HM the Queen. It was resolved not to purchase support from Visionict for the website.

16. Repairs & Maintenance -to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets:

Cllr Benjamin reported that the rotten gate post at the Village Green had been replaced. A latch is to be fitted. The gate post for a second gate is also rotten. The Clerk will check whether that is the PC's responsibility and if so arrange a repair.

New Wheelie Bins Arrive as Council Prepares for Waste Collection Changes

Residents across Mid Devon will start to receive new wheelie bins as the Council prepares to implement its new Bin-it 123 collection service

From October 2022 all black sack/black bin waste will be collected every three weeks as part of the Council's drive to increase recycling and reduce waste. All other collections remain unchanged — with food waste collected weekly and dry recycling each fortnight.

More than 37,000 wheelie bins will be delivered across the district over the next few months, in preparation for the autumn changes, with every household entitled to a free black wheelie bin. Seagull sacks can also be provided instead of a wheelie bin.

Cllr Slade, Cabinet Member for the Environment and Climate Change said:



"Although no one's waste collections will change until the autumn we have to start preparing now. I recognise this is a big change for our residents and we know there may be some resistance, but we have seen what the benefits are to the environment from neighbouring districts and

through our own trial, and I am confident the people of Mid Devon will adapt and support this change."

Trial figures have shown the introduction of the Bin-it 123 collection cycle will increase recycling, reduce the amount of non-recyclable material collected, and reduce CO² emissions, with our waste collection vehicles travelling less miles.

The cost of a year's waste collection in the district is estimated to be around £54 per household.

Cllr Slade added:

"The public quite rightly want value for money and should scrutinise where their money is spent. This change is not about a reduction in cost but about future proofing the service for our communities and ensuring we are making tangible changes to meet our climate ambitions."

The first round of the new collection cycle is due to begin in October.

If like me you are a keen follower of national and international news I'm sure you'll be equally downcast as I am with the state of the world. It seems that all news is bad news. We live in a world of war, drought, flooding and economic chaos. And within this theatre of negative news we have to fit in our local events. Here in Devon we will soon be turning off our hose pipes, not washing our cars and generally doing our best to conserve water supplies. At least at the moment we are spending very little on heating our homes but we have to cook and keep clean.

On a county level I am sorry to report that the ruling group in Devon County Council has decided to 'suspend' the payments of the locality fund. This is a bitter blow to all of those of us who use this money in our communities to help various groups to realise interesting and community-based projects. We do not know how long the 'suspension' will last. Many councillors have protested.

Following my discovery of the huge compensation payments made to motorists,

I called for a report from the relevant Cabinet member concerning the numerous potholes and other road defects in our area.

It seems that there are 711 reported potholes on the Devon county council system. This does not seem many and so I asked where the extra 11 came from because as I'm sure that the 700 are around Crediton and the outlying villages. Amid some laughter there was no serious response. I also pressed the Cabinet member to encourage the Devon County Council Conservative Administration to put pressure on central government to come up with a sensible financial package to help counties to put right the terrible condition of the roads. It is difficult to believe that in certain areas we are not a Third World country. I was assured that negotiations are in progress and my request for an update was granted. As soon as I know more I will let you all know but don't hold your breath!


